#### JOHN WEBB and MARY MONDAY

Source: Written by a granddaughter of Joseph Webb, b. 1832

John Webb was born in England in 1828 and came to Canada with his parents, Charles and Ann Webb, about 1838. They lived for a short time in Prince Edward County, then moved farther inland and settled on the south shore of Rice Lake, hence Webb's Bay got it's name from these early settlers. He was married to Mary Monday, and I rather think they lived on the old homestead, which has been occupied by Webb's ever since, as Jack Webb is living on that place in 1962.

They had 4 sons, John, Joseph, William, and James; five girls, Emma, Sarah, Annie, Jennie, and Dinah. Also, Mr. Gracen, who keeps the store at Roseneath, told me that John Webb's child was the first one to be buried in Merrill's Cemetery in the southeast corner (no stone).

John passed away May 30, 1885 at the age of 57 and was buried in Merrill's Cemetery.

Aunt Mary, in her later years lived with her son Johnnie Webb, as we always called him. I can remember her visiting our home in Baltimore, also in Cobourg. I can recall Mother and I spending the weekend of August 16, 1919 at Johnnie's and Aunt was very sick. She passed away on Thursday, August 21, 1919. Her birthday was January 4, 1830, so she had reached a good old age of 89. She was buried beside her husband.
